

March 21, 1967

The Kershaw County Council meeting was opened at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 21, 1967, with prayer offered by Mr. Myers.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved on motion of Mr. Sheheen, seconded by Mr. Faulkenberry.

After considering a letter from Mr. Arrants relative thereto, Council voted unanimously to pay certain bills (utilities) in the amount of \$30.59 incurred by Mr. Harold Horton in his capacity as Magistrate at Bethune. The motion was made by Mr. Bowers and seconded by Mr. Sessions.

A Resolution was approved unanimously by Council allowing \$879.30 for additional⁴⁰¹ clerical help for a three months' period in the office of the County Auditor. 410

Mr. Faulkenberry moved to accept the low bid of \$2,139.13 submitted by Harter Chevrolet for a 1½ Ton pickup service truck for County's vehicles. The motion was⁶¹⁰ seconded by Mr. Sheheen and unanimously carried.

On motion of Mr. Sheheen, seconded by Mr. Sessions, Council voted unanimously to accept a bid submitted by C. P. DuBose & Son, Inc., for errors and omissions bonds for personnel of the Clerk of Court's office, providing coverage of \$25,000, \$500 deductible, at an annual premium of \$87.24. 4

Council unanimously approved the purchase and erection of street signs in the Kirkland area on motion of Mr. Sheheen, seconded by Mr. Bowers. 60

At Mr. Sheheen's suggestion, Council requested Mr. Rosborough to get a cost estimate (not to exceed \$125 per thousand) from several sources for treated lumber to be used in the repair of bridges in the County.

Mr. Sessions informed Council that Mr. Lawrence McCallum stated he would give property to the County to be used as a garbage dump for the Elgin-Lugoff area on the condition the area is confined and policed. Council asked Mr. Rosborough and Mr. Sessions, with the assistance of Mr. deLoach, to work out a plan for enclosing the area and erecting directional signs to discourage indiscriminate use of the dump. 054

Council unanimously voted on motion of Mr. Sessions, seconded by Mr. Faulkenberry, to paint the exterior of the County Home Demonstration building. 075AA

Council requested Mr. deLoach to meet with the Commissioners of the Buffalo-Mt. Pisgah Fire District as soon as possible and take whatever steps can legally be taken to provide the financial security needed by the District for the purchase of a fire truck. 052

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to reconvene on Tuesday, April 4, 1967, at 9:00 a.m.
